E-cigarette fact sheet for parents and teachers



E-cigarettes pose serious health risks to teens.

In 2019, 18.6% of Australian teens and young adults aged 15-24, who are current tobacco smokers, used e-cigarettes, **an increase from 6.6% in 2016**. A Royal Children's Hospital 'Child Health Poll' found 57% of parents have never discussed e-cigarettes with their teen. Social media is being used extensively by tobacco and e-cigarette companies to **market e-cigarettes to teens and young adults**.

About e-cigarettes

E-cigarettes, also known as **'vapes'**, are **battery operated devices** that work by heating a liquid (or 'juice') until it becomes an aerosol that users inhale.

Some people mistakenly believe the **'cloud'** from vaping is a vapour, like steam. It is really **an aerosol**, a fine spray of **chemicals** that enter the body via the lungs and small particles that can **lodge in the lungs.** Using an e-cigarette is commonly called **'vaping'**.

WHY WE'RE FATHERS FIRST

Fathers have a significant impact on academic achievement as well as the social and emotional wellbeing of their children.



Research shows that schools that specifically target fathers will see better outcomes for kids.

Why directly target fathers?


- Children do better in school when their fathers are involved in their school, regardless of whether their fathers live with them or live apart.
- Children whose fathers participate in school activities, meetings and events also enjoy school more, are less likely to have behaviour issues and are more likely to participate in extracurricular activities.
- Fathers are more likely to engage in school if they are directly invited or targeted.

OUTCOMES:

- Increased student connectedness with school
- Increased physical activity and better health outcomes
- Increased self-esteem and resilience
- · Reduced bullying behaviours
- Reduced delinquent behaviours
- Reduced engagement in unhealthy and risky behaviours
- Reduced alcohol, tobacco and drug use
- Increased social responsibility and social maturity
- Reduced suicide and self-harm
- Reduced substance abuse
